



Communication No 1 – Contract Overview - 1st May 2025

In this series of comms we will look at subjects pertaining to the new contract announced last month. This week we will look at a basic overview of the new contract. The new contract covers 24/25 retrospectively and 25/26.

The money the new contract provides is estimated at an average of £65,200 per pharmacy. CPE have produced an <u>indicative income calculator</u> for pharmacies to check how they are affected individually. Funding has two main elements as described below and despite the increases, it is acknowledged that a significant funding gap remains.

This leaves £42 million of margin to be clawed back over the next 12 months.

2. Service Specific Funding Changes

- a. PFS
 - From April 1st 2025 the fee for Clinical Pathway Consultations and Minor Illness Referral consultations was increased to £17. Urgent supply consultations remain at £15
 - ii. From June 1st the threshold for fixed payments for Clinical Pathway Consultations will be changed to
 - 1. 20-29 consultations \rightarrow £500 monthly payment
 - 2. $30+ \rightarrow$ £1000 monthly payment
 - iii. Caps for Clinical Pathway Consultations have changed and are likely to change in the future dependent on national delivery. This is to ensure that the budget of £215m is not exceeded.
 - iv. Bundling: To claim the above fixed payment for PFS delivery pharmacies will need to also
 - 1. From June 2025, be registered for both the hypertension service and the oral contraceptive service (reminder that if you deregister, there is a period of four months before you can reregister for a service)
 - 2. From October 2025 pharmacies will be required to deliver 1 ABPM per month
 - 3. From March 2026 pharmacies will be required to deliver a specified number of OC consultations details tbd.

b. OC Service

- i. Consultation fee has been increased to £25 (from £18) from April 2025
- ii. From October 2025 (confirmation of date pending) the service will include EHC provision with a service fee of \pounds 20.
- iii. We are discussing with local commissioners how the local funding for EHC may be reallocated within pharmacy once the national EHC service is launched.

c. Hypertension case-finding service

- i. From April 2025 the fee for a BP check is reduced to £10
- ii. From April 2025 the fee for an ABPM is increased to £50.85
- iii. New guidance on the service will be issued, a change to who is eligible for BP checks is expected.

d. NMS

- i. From April the fee structure is simplified \pounds 14 for intervention and \pounds 14 for completion and not a sliding scale.
- ii. Depression will be added to conditions suitable for NMS from October 2025






3. PQS

- a. A reduced PQS of one gateway and two domains.
- b. Between May 1st and 16th pharmacies can claim an aspiration payment of 75% of points (estimated at around £2300) for PQS 25/26. This payment will be made in July 2025
- c. Final declaration can be submitted between 2nd February 2026 and 27th February 2026 and evidence of claims must be available from the end of March 2026.

4. Key Regulatory changes

- a. Removal of need to get patient sign back of levy Rx
- b. Removal of need to get references for new employees
- c. Removal of need to produce a practice leaflet
- d. 25/26 no national or pharmacy chosen clinical audit.
- e. Health Campaigns maximum of two national and two ICB health campaigns
- f. Significant changes to DSP regulations
- g. Changes to core hour adjustment applications.
